Desert Hills explanation: 322 (cohort total) minus 36 (excluded) = **286 grad count**  
 261 (graduates) divided by 286 (grad count) = **91.3% grad rate**  
 19 (dropouts) divided by 286 (grad count) = **6.6% dropout rate**  
 Non-graduate rate is: 2 (continuing) plus 4 (other) = 6/286 = **2.1%**

**Categories**

**Excluded:** Death

Transfer out of state or out of country  
 Transfer to home or private school  
 Foreign students (F-1 or J-1)

**Dropouts:** Withdraw or unknown (no destination high school)

Transfer to adult ed (does not earn GED or diploma with class)  
 Repeating a grade during high school--not graduating with original class

**Non-Graduates:** "Graduation pending" student has until Sept 30th to complete. If not, dropout.

Certificate of Completion (Other Completer)  
 Transfer to adult ed and earns GED or diploma with class (Other completer)  
 Special ed student ages out (Other completer)

**Graduates:** Diplomas earned prior to Sept. 30th of senior year

Early graduates (any semester)

Common record keeping problem: A student that transfers within the state becomes part of the cohort of the new school and is out of the cohort at the old school. (That's good.) If, however, the student enrolls in the new school and is assigned a different SSID number he will remain a member of the old school's cohort. (That's bad.)
